From Zoom Bible studies to a contactless food drive to outdoor worship, our church family has still worshipped, studied, served, and given back to the community - even in these unprecedented days for our time. I've been especially grateful for the opportunity to see so many of you in our outdoor worship services the past few weeks. Each week, your presence is a powerful reminder of the hope and resilience that Jesus Christ brings each one of us. I'm grateful for Gayle Stanley and the Music and Worship Committee's role in planning the services. And I'm grateful for our deacons help in providing a warm welcome and direction to people as they drive in. We're continuing in my sermon series, "Don't Waste a Crisis," in which we'll explore ways that God may used the events of the past several months to make us more like Jesus Christ.

If you don't yet feel comfortable gathering in-person, we understand that. We hope the weekly online worship services will help you connect with our church family when you can't be there in person. You're also welcome to join our Just Mercy book study online on Wednesday nights at 7:00 pm. Wednesday, July 1 will be our second gathering, and we hope you'll join us then. I've found Bryan Stevenson's Just Mercy a helpful guide to understanding some of the racial tensions from a Christian's perspective. Each week, we'll have important conversations on the book and on scripture as we seek God's wisdom in our role in

bringing healing to our community and to our nation. I hope you'll join us for these important conversations.

It's no surprise that out of an abundance of caution, our in-person Vacation Bible School has been cancelled this summer. However, I'm grateful for Crystal Waldrop's creative leadership in securing online VBS material. We plan to send out online VBS content that allows families to do Bible stories, crafts, music, and games at home. We'll send it out the week of July 27. If your family didn't sign up for VBS, but you'd like to take advantage of this at-home VBS opportunity, you may sign up at www.goochland-church.org/children. Feel free to invite friends!

Know that our Regathering Team is still meeting to consider the safest ways for us to regather as a church family. For the time being, our plan is to continue holding outdoor worship services and offering up our pavilion for socially-distanced Sunday School and small group gatherings. As we've seen over the past few months, even as things all around us change, we can be confident in this: Jesus Christ and his love for us will not change. I truly believe that he wants to use this unusual season to help us grow as individuals and as a church family. I hope that you'll find ways to watch and listen for the Spirit's presence in your lives – and ways you can help others do the same. May God bless you this July!

OUTDOOR WORSHIP GUIDELINES

GBC is holding a 30-40 minute worship service at 10:00 am on Sundays.

- Pastor Curt will preach from the top of the sanctuary steps.
- Attendees are asked to bring a lawn chair or blanket to sit on.
 - Everyone will practice social distancing please stay at least 6 feet from others outside your family.
 - Everybody is encouraged to wear a mask. Please bring one with you from home. If you don't have a mask, we'll have extra masks available.
 - o Masks and hand sanitizer will be available.

Those who would like to worship from their car may pull up in front of the sanctuary to our drive up area. (A greeter will show you where to park.)

· Please turn your car's engine off and roll down your windows.

The Breezeway will be reserved for those who might need more level ground and shade.

Who should attend?

- · Only those who feel comfortable worshiping outdoors should attend.
- If you have had a fever, cough, or shortness of breath, please worship with us online instead.

What should I bring?

- Bring your own lawn chair or picnic blanket to sit on.
- · Bring your Bible.
- If you'd like to give to our church offering, there will be a box in which you may place your offering. For the safety of our tellers, we are only accepting check no cash or coins, please.
- Bring a bottle of water to stay hydrated.

What will I touch?

- Only your own chair.
- We will not be passing anything out (bulletins, hymnals, plates etc.)
- When we celebrate the Lord's Supper, we'll offer pre-packaged elements that you can pick up from a table or you may bring your own.

Will the buildings be open?

• The New Building will be opened for bathrooms. Sanitized bathrooms will be available for use, but all other rooms will be closed and off-limits.

What if I'm not comfortable regathering in-person?

- It's ok we get it! Please don't come unless you feel comfortable.
- We will still offer online worship Sunday mornings on YouTube and Facebook. It will include the same message Pastor Curt preaches in person.
- Zoom Sunday School will be offered online for children.

What about bad weather?

- In the event of bad weather, the service will be canceled by 8:00 am on Sunday morning.
- Our website and Facebook will indicate cancellations. In addition, an automated phone call will go
 out to the church family indicating outdoor worship has been canceled.
